I called into see Graeme and Robyn to thank them for looking after our Chooks, Guinea Pigs and my vegie garden whilst we were away in the Gong.

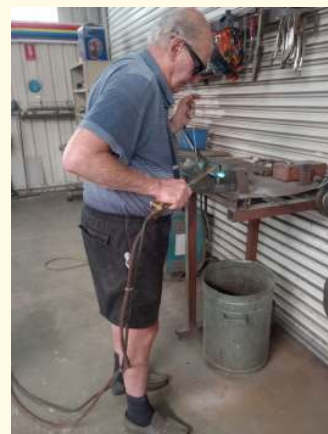
I found Graeme once again helping out doing a brazing job on a bike part for Club member John Simpfendorfer.

After the Pandemic-delayed "99 Not Out" Run, which finally happened in March this year, the eagerly anticipated "100 Not Out", The "Ton Run" was staged in Cootamundra over the weekend of 19th and 20th November.

This was a celebration of 100 years of motorcycling to honour the original motorcycle club that staged a reliability trial over a distance of some 166 miles in eight hours and was open to sidecars and motorcycles of under 350cc's and over 350cc's. First prize was a cup and 10 guineas, second prize five guineas, with two guineas for third. The said club has had many name changes over the years and eventually folded in the early 1980's. It was responsible in early times of running short circuit racing on the tight tricky Meemar Circuit on the edge of Cootamundra, on land leased from the Smith Family (the charity organisation). Observed trials eventually were run by the club after the strict speedway laws deemed the Meemar track safety fences unsafe. The Trials were staged on Government land and hosted State and National titles before they ceased in 1976.

Fortunately, the Cootamundra Antique Motor Club welcomed a fresh lot of new members that have motorcycles that qualified for Classic Club registration. This was a perfect chance to think about staging events under the banner of the Mother Club, hence the beginning of the 100 year celebration of the original Cootamundra Motorcycle Club.

This was two years in the making and worth every committee meeting and lots of effort to bring the event to fruition. In March we had 25 bikes plus support people, this time around we had 53 motorcycles participate, some with pillions, back-up vehicles and corner marshals and officials, 75 in all.

We were flagged off by long time member and accomplished dirt track and trials rider, Eddie Collingridge. Our area hadn't been too badly effected by flooding and the road conditions overall were reasonably good but some parts needed some careful navigation, reminiscent of what it would have been like 100 years ago. The riders set off on the 140km journey with a morning tea stop in Harden/Murrumburrah, then onto the Cherry Capital, Young, for lunch. We were spoilt by friendly Country hospitality from the CWA ladies and Rotary Club Folks at both stops. Bellies full, we returned to Cootamundra and prepared for the celebration dinner and presentations at the Cootamundra Ex-Services Club.

A casual coffee run of 50 kilometres to Stockinbingal, which departed from the centre of Town on Sunday morning, saw us back in Cootamundra well before lunch so travellers could load up and head home.

It was a fantastic weekend of fellowship and a lovely collection of motorcycles that everyone appreciated. The Committee will discuss further the viability of staging future events. Stay tuned.

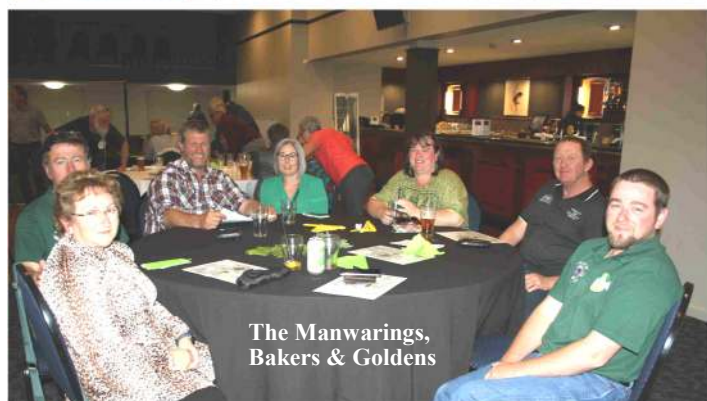

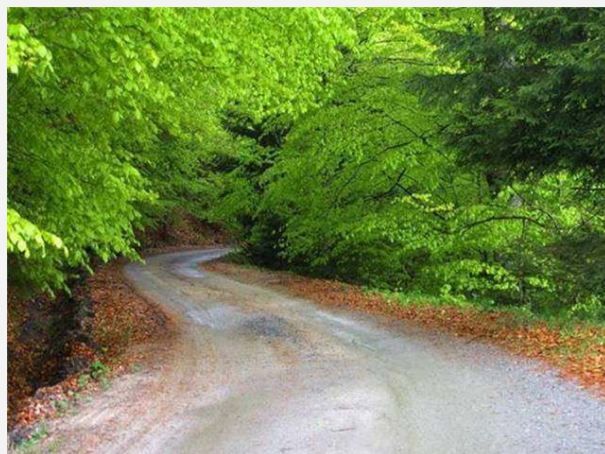
