

<u>1926 - SYDNEY REFEREE NEWSPAPER REPORTED</u> 3rd November 1926

Cootamundra Racecourse Speedway

The sport of motorcycle racing is increasing in popularity across the country. On Thursday a great crowd saw Kev Carmody win the Riverina Championship at the Cootamundra Racecourse Speedway. He defeated A Faunce and covered the ten miles in 9 min and 40 secs. Though his chain came off, H Hulford had a nasty fall and sustained concussion. In the Patrons Handicap, Faunce attained the highest speed of the afternoon of 65 and 1/5 mph.

In 1924 1925 it was recorded that the Cootamundra Motorcycling Club held meetings at the Cootamundra Motor Speedway at Stockinbingal, the exact location of the track is unknown.

In 1926 a new seven furlong length banked speedway was constructed at the Cootamundra Racecourse, 2000 people attended the opening meeting in October, Kev Carmody won the 10 mile Riverina Championship.

Thanks to Doug Hulford for these great snippets of Coota history . . . Let's hope that "Pluvius restrains his watering can" on our 'Ton Plus One' Weekend in November ! The enthusiasts of the Cootamundra club are losing no time with the preparation of their speedway on the racecourse, and the next programme held there should attract a big crowd. It will be the Maroubra of this part of the State.





PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES: were adopted on the motion of Phil V and Peter H.

BUSINESS ARISING: Nil.

FINANCE REPORT: The Financial Report prepared by Hugh was tabled; this showed an opening balance of \$2,516-16 and expenses of \$464.08, being \$43.11 for wrist bands, \$360.00 for 100 CAMC/CMCC stubby holders and \$60.97 for catering during Goulburn M/Cycle Club visit. This left a balance of \$2,192.07 as at 15th July.

Wrist Bands: Phil V passed around a sample of the wrist bands for our perusal, getting the tick of approval.

Accounts Payable: A motion was put forward by Mark L to give Hugh the authority to pay accounts as they arrived and not wait for the next meeting. This was seconded by Phil V and carried.

Expenses: Another motion was laid down by John S that Hugh be reimbursed for the out of pocket expenses he incurs with supplies for all the printing etc. he does for our committee. This was dismissed by Hugh for the time being.

Cloth Patches: Phil V reported that "YES Embroidery" in Young (our past supplier) will be shutting their doors on August 31st, unless they can find a buyer for the business. It was because of this that a decision was made to order 80 patches from YES Embroidery A.S.A.P. The motion was made by Mark L, seconded by Jeff Price and carried.

Phil has sourced a business in Melbourne that can fill future orders at the following prices: Setup fee \$70, Cost of patches \$12 each (\$10 each if more than 20 ordered).

Entry Forms: A discussion on sending out the entry forms then followed. It was decided that the entry forms be sent by E-Mail and Text where available, and the remainder be sent by post. Illabo Speedway: Lynn also has a limited number of family passes, for sale at a cost of \$10 each, to the Speedway at Illabo on 12th August; proceeds from the ticket sales are going to a good cause.

**** Salvos Toy Run:** Jeff P reported that the Toy Run this year will be on Saturday 2nd December and that the paper work was about to be submitted. He also said that the Restorers Club was getting on board with it again this year.

Club 'Wheel': Paul A presented Phil V with the Club's wheel trophy for putting one of his Honda Goldwings on club registration.
